

Roots + Wings Factsheet BBC Radio 4 Appeal Research March 2023



Overview

- The Radio 4 Appeal is a weekly 3-minute programme highlighting the work of a charity and appealing for donations. The appeal is broadcast every Sunday at 07:54 and 21:25 and again on Thursday at 15:27.
- 49 appeals are broadcast on Radio 4 each year.
- Presenters contribute their time and services for free usually a celebrity ambassador or prominent journalist/broadcaster, but beneficiaries and service users have also presented appeals.
- BBC producers work with the selected charities to craft the scripts.
- Charities meeting the <u>criteria</u> can apply for an appeal. The applications are assessed by a panel of external assessors and the Appeals Advisory Committee, which is comprised of independent experts from outside the BBC with wide experience of the charitable sector.

Past Results

Highest amounts raised (Apr 2022 – Jan 2023)

- 1. Awards for Young Musicians £52.5k (Aug 2022)
 - o Funding and support for young musicians from low income families
 - Presented by Jess Gillam, saxophonist and broadcaster, who spoke about how AYM supported her journey. She also shared the story of current AYM musician Aaliyah, a 13 year old clarinetist from Hull.
 - o The charity made a short 1-minute film with Jess and Aaliyah to promote the appeal, put out on their social media channels
 - o Created a dedicated campaign page on their website
 - Media coverage in Music Teacher magazine, Music Week, and Music News,
- 2. <u>Missing People</u> £43.5k (Dec 2022)
 - Services for missing children
 - Presented by Nicki Durbin, mother of missing person Luke Durbin



- Tied into their Christmas appeal supporters provided matched funding up to £15,000 for all Radio 4 donations
- o Created a dedicated campaign page on their website encouraging supporters to tune in and donate online
- Offered suggested donation amounts from £11.53 (to answer a helpline call, supporting parent of a missing child) to £500 (recruit and train a hotline volunteer to support 100 people per year)
- 3. Theirworld £39.9k (Jan 2022)
 - o Education for refugee and disadvantaged children
 - Presented by David Tennant, actor
 - o He shared the story of Omer, a 15 y/o refugee from Syria living in a refugee camp, who is now receiving an education
 - o Appeal ran on New Years' Day and was promoted by David Tennant's official and fan sites, as well as social media

Date	Charity	Presenter	Story/message
26 March	Amref Health Africa	Gurinder Chadha, actor	Raising funds for solar-powered mobile clinics and health worker training, to deliver vital services to communities in Africa Story of Phanice Kwamboka, a mother in Kenya who has diabetes and relies on Amref's mobile clinic for treatment.
19 March	Comic Relief	Emma Willis, broadcaster	Focuses on one local organisation funded by Comic Relief – Streetlife, which helps homeless people in Blackpool. Emphasises UK cost of living crisis – theme of Red Nose Day appeal.



12 March	Renewable World	Amita Suman, actress	Focuses on impact of solar-powered water lifting systems in Nepal, which bring clean water to remote villages, improving children's health and education. Story of Sumitra, a 14 year old girl who collects water every morning, making her late for school.
5 March	Freedom from Torture	Adjoa Andoh, actor	Leads with the story of Nasrin, an Iranian human rights campaigner who was imprisoned and tortured for 8 years before coming to the UK and being helped to recover by FfT. Focus on how the charity provides therapy to help survivors rebuild their lives and regain their voice, so they can share their stories.
26 February	Raising Futures Kenya	Gemma Cairney, broadcaster	Leads with the story of Linet, who was orphaned at 11 and became a mother to twins after sexual abuse. She is now a businesswoman after receiving counselling and job skills training from RFK. Raising money for training centres that offer young people, particularly young women, free access to vocational and business skills courses, counselling and practical support.
19 February	National Youth Orchestra of Great Britain	Alison Balsom, trumpet soloist	Focusses on making orchestral music more accessible – NYO Inspire programme offers free places for teenagers to develop their skills. Features Cai, a teenage girl who benefitted from the programme.
12 February	Christian Blind Mission UK	Giles Brandreth, broadcaster	Sight-restoring cataract surgery can cost just £95, but is out of reach in the world's poorest places. Story of Memory, a young girl in Malawi whose sight was restored via cataract surgery and can now go to school.
5 February	Cecily's Fund	Lwiza Mulenga, Volunteer in Zambia	Help vulnerable children in Zambia access education by building women's financial independence and training older teenagers as mentors and role models Features the story of Noria – who was able to stay in school and eventually become a teacher after her mum was helped by Cecily's Fund.
29 January	Justice and Care	Simon Thomas, TV presenter	It is estimated that there are 100,000 victims of modern slavery in the UK – Justice for Care helps them rebuild their lives after exploitation and engage with police to secure justice. Tells story of James, a beneficiary whose home was taken over by a criminal gang.
